COVER: Robert Covington, Hospital Corpsman, 3rd Class, fills a prescription at the U.S. Naval Hospital in San Diego (December 1956). In the late 1950s, this hospital pharmacy claimed to be one of the busiest in the country, dispensing about 1000 prescriptions daily. The evolution of institutional pharmacy practice in the United States is discussed within this issue in two articles looking at the 1964 publication of *Mirror to Hospital Pharmacy* and its influence. At the time of the Audit of Pharmaceutical Service in Hospitals (1957), reported in *Mirror*, prescription compounding and drug distribution were the central components of institutional practice.—G. H.
